### YWCA Hamilton Uplift Program -Advanced Manufacturing

The YWCA Hamilton Uplift Program provides women and non-binary people with the opportunity to reskill or upskill in the advanced manufacturing and specialized technology fields through certification training and additional supports related to navigating non-traditional workplaces and job development. All training expenses are covered by the program, and paid by YWCA Hamilton.

Participants in the **Advanced Manufacturing stream** complete a set of **three micro-credentials** through McMaster Manufacturing Research Institute (MMRI), and a **leadership communication course** through Brescia University College. During and after certification, YWCA Hamilton provides ongoing wraparound services to support participants, including mentorship.

### **Career Opportunities in Ontario**

Advanced manufacturing is the **implementation of new technologies for product and process improvement** to ensure business success and competitiveness. The world is about to embark on a **cleantech revolution**, as countries race to hit net-zero emissions, creating a need to redesign manufacturing in many of Ontario's 21 industry sectors.

In Ontario, all positions show a **growth rate of 10%**. Average earnings for manufacturing technologists and technicians is \$62k annually; aircraft assemblers and inspectors average \$67k; central control and process operators average \$87k; electrical/electronics engineers average \$98k.\*

- Relevant Bachelor degree, diploma and/or industry experience
- Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- Canadian Language Benchmark levels 7-8

Training is anticipated to run for 36 weeks, from March to December 2022. A blend of asynchronistic technical learning modules and synchronistic (virtual) leadership skill building content to help you build personal capacity to effect change in a male dominated environment.
