Moreover, the program provides introduction to electrical and safety training, which can enhance employability and make candidates more appealing to potential employers, thereby benefiting individuals seeking gainful employment.

We selected our partners meticulously, in line with our dedication to making deliberate efforts to create new pathways for individuals who have not had straightforward access to the trades.

The Entry Pointz Program aims to accomplish the following objectives:

- Deliver training for First Aid/CPR AED
- Provide training for Global Harmonized WHMIS
- Develop a fundamental comprehension of safety requirements and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
- Deliver training for Electrical Theory and Practical Skills
- Gain certifications such as Working at Heights and Electrical Hazard Safety
- Learn to operate machinery and earn a Power Elevating Work Platform Operator & Rough Terrain Forklift
   Operator Certifications
- And much more

To achieve these goals, we will utilize a combination of theoretical classroom instruction, Virtual Reality (VR), and practical. Our project managers and lead trainers will also serve as mentors during the training process, offering guidance through in-person meetings or Zoom sessions. Upon obtaining the certifications throughout the program, individuals will have enhanced their chances of securing employment in the electrical and/or construction industry.

#### **Application Requirements:**

- Resume
- 500-word typed essay explaining why you should be chosen and what you will bring to the classroom.
- Applicants must provide proof of meeting the educational requirements by submitting their high school
  transcripts. These transcripts should demonstrate completion of one Math, one English, and one Physics
  course as outlined in the chart below. These foundational subjects are essential for success in trade
  school programs. If you lack any of the required courses, you can still apply and work towards obtaining
  the necessary credentials either through night classes or virtual learning.
