Details Of The Project

At home, create something together using at least one of The Arts (i.e., Music, Drama, Dance, or Visual Arts). What you create should tell a story. While we're excited to see the final product, we're even more interested in the thinking/story behind this product. Here are some things that you can do together.

- Make a painting.
- Draw a portrait.
- Create a sculpture.
- Create a work of art from items found in the environment (e.g., pinecones, leaves, etc.).
- Create a work of art from loose parts (e.g., gems, little rocks, popsicle sticks, etc.).
- Build a structure. Think about the artistic design.
- Create a logo.
- Create your own dance or movement to a particular piece of music.

- Play a song.
- Sing a song.
- Make up your own song (we do this a lot in class).
- Put on a play.
- Take on different character roles using dolls or small toys.
- Play house, restaurant, movie theatre, or anything else that you might want to play together.
- Get creative! There's no limit on what you can do here.

Feel free to take a picture or short video showcasing what you do. We can always put this up on the SMART Board. Children can also just share their work in class, or do a combination of the two.

For their V.I.P. presentation, students will have an opportunity to share what they did or created <u>and</u> the story behind their work. We really want to hear this story! Oral storytelling is such an important component of reading and writing. Children can also feel free to draw or write the story that they want to read and share with the class. We hope that the opportunity to share stories will help children further see the connection between The Arts and language.
