WRITING Let your child scribble and draw and then 'sign' their name on the drawing.	<p>Good readers have a large vocabulary. Knowing lots of words helps children better understand what they read. You can help them learn by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Having plenty of conversations. Take turns talking. It is important for you to ask questions and listen to what your children say in response. Read together! A lot! Make connections. Connect what you are reading in books to their lives. "Yes, Grandma has a black cat, too." Repetition. Children often love to read the same book over and over. This is a good habit, as repeated readings help build vocabulary. 					
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Scout Says Game (May 8 activity)

Designate someone as 'Scout'.

Scout gives commands either by saying "Scout Says...touch your toes" or leaving off the "Scout says" part and only saying "touch your toes."

Players should only do the action when Scout uses the words "Scout Says" before issuing a command.

Commands can include: Jump up and down; Pat your head; Clap your hands; Touch your toes; Sit down.

(*Fingers flutter up and down*)


The seeds begin to grow...


