

Auditory Learning Strategies



Auditory Learners benefit from:

- talking to others regarding their learning**
- rehearsing information out loud**
- recording information they want to learn or remember (choose from various forms of technology- iPods, iPads, livescribe pens)**
- reading a book and listening to an audio version of that book at the same time (audio books for mp3 players or iPods)**
- using a tune to rehearse information they want to learn**
- a quiet, focused learning environment (ie. using earphones to block out noise, choosing a quiet space, listening to quiet classical music)**
- expanding on notes by talking to others and looking at the textbook (notes may be poor because they like to listen)**
- explaining notes to a buddy**
- speaking answers out loud or in their head before they write them**
- using speech to text software (ie. Dragon Naturally Speaking)**
- giving oral reports or answering questions orally**
- discuss answer with a partner before writing them down**
