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How To Make Eggless Cookies!

Ingredients:

- Room temperature butter- ¼ cup
 - Powdered/icing/confectioners- 1 cup
 - Vanilla extract- 1 tsp
 - All purpose flour (maida)- 1 ¼ cup
 - Cocoa powder- ¼ cup
 - Baking powder ½ tsp
 - Pinch of salt (don't use salt if you've used salted butter)
 - Milk- 2 tbsp
-

Instructions:

1. Beat butter, sugar and vanilla extract until light and fluffy
2. Sift the flour, cocoa powder and baking powder into the butter mixture
3. Mix gently with a spatula until it forms a crumbly consistency
4. Crumble with your hands until there's no more big chunks and looks like the colour of your cocoa powder
5. Add your milk to the chocolate mixture and knead it until it's doughy

TIP: If you want to add chocolate chips, now would be the time

6. Roll them into balls and flatten slightly

TIP: If you want to add any filling. Do it now. If you want to add filling then melt your filling until it's thick or stiffen it in the fridge. To add to your cookies, roll the dough into balls and flatten quite a bit, add your chocolate in the centre (make sure it is just a little bit so they don't burst in your hands or while baking) shape the dough back into balls andDONE!!

7. Bake at 350 for 17 minutes on a tray covered with parchment paper.

How to Make Brownies with Frosting

Ingredients for Brownies 6 tbsp melted butter 1 cup white sugar 2 eggs 1 tsp vanilla extract 1/3 cup unsweetened cocoa powder ½ cup all purpose flour ¼ tsp salt (BUT...don't include the salt if you are using salted butter) ¼ tsp baking powder	Ingredients for Frosting 3 tbsp room temperature butter 3 tbsp unsweetened cocoa powder 1 tbsp honey 1 tsp vanilla extract 1 cup confectioners sugar
Instructions to make Brownies 1. Preheat the oven to 350 2. Grease an 8 inch square pan with butter and cover it with a bit of flour 3. Mix everything together until you have a smooth consistency 4. Pour batter into pan and bake for 25-30 minutes, making sure not to overbake. Poke with a toothpick and when the toothpick comes out clean, they are done. 5. ENJOY!!!!	Instructions to make Frosting 1. Mix everything together 2. Let brownies cool slightly 3. Frost your brownies while they are warm 4. ENJOY!!!

Bullying, the Biggest Problem in Schools

What is Bullying?

Bullying has no single definition but can be simplified to unwanted behaviour from a person. It can be hurting or causing distress to others bullying can be related to age, disability, nationality, race, religion, gender, weight, height, size, or any individual's personal characteristics. There are four different types of bullying: physical; when someone is physically harming you, verbal; when someone is saying something harmful to you, social; when someone is spreading rumours and humiliating you, and cyber, when someone is distressing you on-line. Why do people bully? Some people bully for things they are dealing with like any type of trauma, home environment, peer pressure, wanting to fit in or even just for drama.

Effects of Bullying

It is proven that bullying has increased violence against other and suicide. Bullying can cause depression, anxiety, low self-esteem, isolation, secrecy, bad concentration, anger, aggression, and feeling helpless. Now cyberbullying is quite common because many kids and teens go on social media, on-line games and/or on-line class. Cyberbullying can cause emotional and physiological damage to victims.

What to do if you, or someone you know is bullied?

If you are being bullied; tell a trusted adult or friend, ask for help, leave if you see the bully, distract the bully to leave, pretend the bully is not affecting you (sometimes bullies will move on if they see they are not affecting you) and keep reminding yourself you are a great person and worthy of respect. If you see or know someone who is being bullied DO NOT IGNORE, tell a trusted adult, move toward the victim, and say “STOP” to the bully, friend the victim and take them away from the bully and remember do not do something that will put you in harm's way. If you are bullying, talk to a trusted adult, think about how you would feel if you were being bullied and think about the victim's feeling.
