


Count the number of animals in each box and point to the number that matches.







Is a pencil heavier or lighter than a stapler?


Talk about each pair of pictures and discuss which one would be heavier.

This has so much opportunity for learning number comparison, counting, and thinking skills.








Children may be quick to answer this question with the blue bucket but we want to know why they think that way.
