At its core, experiential learning is a student-centered approach to teaching and learning that helps children, youth and adult learners develop the habits of reflecting, questioning, wondering and deliberating to inform action.

Reflecting and Connecting

One of the fastest ways to create an atmosphere of inclusion within a group is to help the members of the group identify others within the group that share their same interests, opinions and choices.

TRY THIS:

Have students in a chat pod, through a discussion area or via a posted picture, share their ideas about a particular subject area.
