
Life Skill and Leisure Learning by Penny & Katy

Written instructions for Ant Crafts

Egg Carton Ant

Materials:

- egg carton
- construction paper
- paint
- paint brush
- glue
- scissors



Instructions:

- 1. Cut a strip of 3 cups from the cardboard egg carton.
- 2. Paint the cups and let dry. This strip of cups will be the ant's body.
- 3. Cut 6 strips of construction paper about a cm wide and 5 cm long for the legs. Fold each leg in half.
- 4. Cut 2 strips of construction paper about ½ cm wide and 3 cm long for the antennae.
- 5. Glue the legs onto the body and bend at the fold so the legs appear bent.
- 6. Glue the antennae to where the head of the ant will be.

Fingerprint Ants

Materials:

- paint
- paper plate
- marker

Instructions:

- 1. Place a dollop of paint onto a paper plate.
- 2. Press tip of finger into paint so that it covers fingerprint.
- 3. Press painted fingertip onto paper. Press again just below first print and again under second print.
- 4. These three fingerprints will make the three segments of the ant's body.
- 5. To make more ants press finger into paint again and repeat step #3.
- 6. Use a marker to add 6 legs to each ant and two antennae on the head.
