



The possibilities of online software

Many of you have already ventured down the path of open source Web 2.0 tools such as Bitstrips, Glogster and Prezi. I'm hoping that the frustrations we have encountered will not deter you from trying them again or attempting a different one to change up a culminating task.

For Prezi, simply sign-up at prezi.com. We encourage students to title their prezis using their names so the teacher can search by first and last name. If this doesn't work, the students can send you the links to their prezis.

For Bitstrips, go to bitstripsforschool.com and click on the Ontario teachers link to set up your ac-

count and then your class. If this sounds too time-consuming, we will be happy to do it for you. By creating the class, all of the bitstrips will be in one place and students can use classmates' avatars in their own comics.

For Glogster, go to eduglogster.com. You will need to give the following code to the students: 3G22HE. They set up individual accounts using this code. We strongly suggest that students put the name of their teacher in front of their first names (i.e valerisarah) when registering so the names will appear alphabetically and you will not have to search through 200 accounts.
